- 191/20 **OPEN PERIOD**
No members of the public present – nothing was brought to Councillors attention.
- 192/20 **THE MINUTES** of the meeting held on Wednesday, 14th October 2020 had been circulated previously and were agreed as a true record.
- MATTERS ARISING**
- 193/20 169/20 – Speed visors – Clerk awaiting help from SWARCO to get the data program downloaded and working.
The Speedwatch group can't go out at the moment – the equipment they use is with another group – Clerk to contact PC Hosking and check what is happening. He is liaising with Colin Brown.
- 194/20 170/20 – Tree in Sand Park – Clerk has received report giving advice on tree – needs reducing by about a third . Will require permission from Cornwall Council as in a Conservation Area – clerk to submit report and then ask for quotes from Tree surgeons.

Six builders have been approached to quote for the work, but have only received 1 quote back . Will contact the builder to see if he is happy to continue as the quote is several months old now. Need to proceed if possible. Have done a best value process – so hope to be able to go ahead with the builder.

CORNWALL COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

Cllr Egerton gave his report of recent events. Now entered second lock-down and the economy will suffer..

CC – Although many shops and business's now closed –leisure centres etc, the recycling centres will be open.

- New Airport – currently closed – future is uncertain

Local issues:

- Council Re-organisation Order – it is official now that the parishes of Tregony and Cuby will be merged to form Tregony with Cuby parish from 1st April 2021. Cllr Egerton has been made 'Responsible person' to oversee the preparation and move to the new body.

A background body will meet to sort out issues – precept going forward, bank account, website, transfer of assets, insurance, Burial Board and Clerking.

Councillors were asked if they would represent and join in the background committee to prepare – Cllrs Michell, Mackenzie, Floyd Norris and Matthews agreed.

- Muckey Lane – the tip is still being investigated – the enforcement officer is reaching agreement with the land owner and hopefully the site will be cleared and fenced.
- Andrew Richards case – the Cormac case has been in the press again recently.

OTHER PARISH BUSINESS
